It isn't enough to just have people share their secrets, rather we hope that students will find freedom from their secrets through Jesus. In our large group which ended our "No Secrets' outreach week, over 100 students gathered to learn that they didn't have to live a shameful or hidden life because



of the secrets they have. Through the the story of the prodigal son in Luke 15 they were reminded of how God the father accepts everyone, just like the younger son, no matter what we have done or what has been done to us.

Upon entering the room, each student was given a rock representing their secret and how it weighs them down. At the end of the night students were invited to let go of their rock, release their secret to Jesus and allow Him to take that burden from them. Out of 100 students, more than 40 students responded and got prayer. Praise God!

Even though the outreach is over, please continue to pray that students will continue to find freedom from their secrets and accept the gift of forgiveness and love that God has for them.

Working Towards a Base

Even though I have raised my budget for this school year, to create a sustainable ministry it is important to

have a consistent base of supporters for the years to come. Currently, I have raised 50% of my budget for next year. My goal is to be at a 90% base by June 30th so that when the next school year starts I can focus on the ministry on campus rather than on fundraising. A 90% base consists of monthly and yearly supporters who are committed to the ministry for the future years. Only 18 new \$100/month partners are needed to reach this goal.
